

The Way of Salvation Diagram Explained

1) Blank 1

- a) Turn to **Matthew 7:13-14**, read aloud, and discuss.
- b) On the first blank of the first page, answer the following question: Which way is said to lead to destruction?
- c) Next, turn to **Isaiah 53:6**, read aloud, and discuss.
- d) Continuing with the first blank, write a colon and then answer the following question:
What has each of us, like sheep turned aside to?

2) Illustration 1

- a) Now draw a broad way down the page which leads to eternal destruction.
- b) Draw flames on the bottom to represent the destination for all who are on the broad way.

3) Blank 2

- a) Turn to the other side of the page.
- b) Review **Matthew 7:13-14** again and on the second blank, answer the following question:
Which way is said to lead to life?
- c) Next, turn to **John 14:6**, read aloud, and discuss.
- d) Continuing with the second blank, write a colon and then answer the following question:
Who is the narrow way?

4) Illustration 2

- a) Now draw a broad way again, but only on the left side of the page, leaving an inch wide opening in the lower right section.
- b) Next, draw a narrow way that runs from the inside of the broad way, through the opening, and then curves heavenward.
- c) Afterward, draw three crosses inside of the narrow way next to each of the rectangles that contain blanks 3, 4, and 5.
- d) Finally, read the verses next to the remaining blanks, one at a time, and record the aspect of salvation represented. None of these aspects of salvation would be possible without Christ's crucifixion and resurrection.
